# 2002-2022: Founders Hall 20th Anniversary Spotlight

Over the last two decades, we've had many classes that have been so popular they have become embedded in our curriculum. Among the staples is Toni McKeen's genealogy program. Described as a way of gathering information about one's family using census and immigration research, it has evolved into a way to preserve family stories for generations to come.

Toni has been teaching genealogy since the spring of 2004 and is inspired by her students to be the best teacher she can be. "The tears of joy when someone finds a grandmother in a census... we share in each other's excitement," Toni said.

Toni credits her classes' ongoing popularity with the continuously changing technology that allows research to continue advancing. New information is constantly added, making the discoveries endless.

Bonnie Weber's oil painting, Ira Joe Fisher's poetry class, and Mike Settanni's history classes have also been extraordinarily popular, maintaining consistent enrollment for close to 2 decades. While new classes and subjects are constantly added, these classics endured.
