Classical Wisdom: Growing Older ~ On Zoom

'If you have a garden and a library, you have everything you need.' - Cicero

Marcus Tullius Cicero (106-43BCE) distinguished lawyer, orator, politician and philosopher wrote his two timeless essays 'On Old Age' and 'On Friendship' at age 63 during the last year of his life. The treatise on old age poses four familiar arguments against the all too prevalent and dismal prospect of growing old in the form of an exquisite dialogue between two younger men and Cicero in the guise of an older man. The second essay is a practical yet eloquent examination of the genesis and nurturance of long-lived friendships so vital to the experience of a rich and meaningful latter half of life. Our common text will be <u>Two Essays on Old Age and Friendship</u>, translation by E.S. Shuckburgh and published by the Leopold Classic Library. We the People ~ In-Person

The first three words of the preamble to the U.S. Constitution immediately differentiate this document from all those declarations of rights that had come before it. Who were the men, that are now referred to as the Framers of the Constitution? What were their main concerns and how do they echo today in our lives, over 230 years later? Why did they pick our form of government? Why even before the ink was dry on the main Seven Articles of the Constitution, did they feel the need to add the first ten amendments, known today as the Bill of Rights? What were the driving forces behind future important amendments?

We will first review the main body of the original seven articles. Each will be reviewed with an eye toward their interpretation then and now. We will investigate the rather arcane institution known as the electoral college. The rules of the Senate, which are nowhere in the constitution yet impact our lives, will also get a closer look.

We will also review some of the key rights bestowed in the U.S. Constitution such as freedom of speech, freedom of religion, the right to bear arms, and the right to due process and equal protection under the law. And, observe how the application of those rights has changed over time.

The goal of our journey is not to develop a cadre of Constitutional scholars but to fulfill Thomas Jefferson's famous challenge "...a well-informed electorate is a prerequisite to democracy."

These discussions will occur over two semesters. The first eight weeks will cover the main articles of the Constitution, the rules of government. The second semester will cover the Bill of Rights and other key amendments.

For our common text, we will use The U.S. Constitution annotated by Ray Raphael available via the registration form for \$8.

The Salem Witch Trials at the New York Historical Society

Even after 300 years, Salem's witch trials remain a defining example of intolerance and injustice in American history. The extraordinary events of 1692-3 led to the deaths of 25 innocent people, the vast majority of whom were women. Organized by the Peabody Essex Museum, *The Salem Witch Trials: Reckoning and Reclaiming* includes tangible fragments from the past that illuminate the real lives of Salem's residents: those accused of witchcraft, their accusers, and those who defended them against legal charges, risking their own lives and reputations in the process. The exhibition seeks to ask: In moments of injustice, what role do we play?

We will have a guided tour of the exhibit and time to explore the museum. Lunch is available for purchase at the Parliament Cafe in the museum, a quick-service option for prepackaged salads, sandwiches, pastries, and coffee/tea.

Drawing 3-2-3 ~ Deconstructive and Re-Constructive Freehand Drawing (predominantly graphite pencil) ~ In-Person

An homage and genuflect to Cooper Union's 'Freehand Drawing' professor, Irwin Rubin, this course will focus on developing a better understanding of visualizing and drawing three dimensional objects.
