Back in the Saddle: How to Use Mindfulness to Tame Emotions

Emotions can be overwhelming and confusing, and when they persist or stagnate, emotions can drag us down. Usually, we repress or discount them when they're uncomfortable, or get carried away when they're exciting. In either case, we get 'thrown off our horse' by the emotion's force.

Mindfulness offers a way to work with emotions that is clear-eyed, direct and gentle. It's an approach similar to horsemanship, where the rider and horse relate properly to each other so that they can go where they need to go.

The class continues Founders Hall's series on how mindfulness meditation can be of practical use in daily life. The class includes guided mindfulness practice, discussions and instruction on how mindfulness clarifies our relation to emotions of all kinds. Class will meet April 5, 12, 19 and May 3 and 10.

From Mediæval Chansons to Tchaikowsky's *Romeo and Juliet*, from Mozart's operas to Gershwin's *Porgy and Bess*, and from Puccini's *La Bohéme* to Cole Porter's '*What is this thing called love?*', the power and mystery of love has been the prime source of some of the greatest music ever written. But as the Roaring Twenties dies down, Europe is entering the 1930's, an increasing time of fight - or flight - as the world staggers from one global conflict to another. Michael Lankester weaves together these two seemingly unconnected worlds by focusing on Paris and Berlin and the turbulent lives of such luminaries as Ernest Hemmingway, Zelda and Scott Fitzgerald, Kurt Weill and Lotte Lenya, Charlie Chaplin and Lee Miller, Marlene Dietrich and Josef von Sternberg, Salvador Dali and Gala, and Picasso and Marie Thèrése Walter.

The Oxford Inklings Part 2 ~ In-Person The Imaginative Mind and the Pursuit of Power

At the end of the 1920s, a close friendship had begun to develop between two Oxford dons, C.S. Lewis and J.R.R. Tolkien, and this small nucleus would soon expand into a group which became known as The Inklings and has since acquired almost legendary status. As the poet and scholar John Wain observed, 'In a very dead period of Oxford's history, Lewis and his friends provided a stir of life.' The Inklings arguably gave rise to one canonical classic of English literature, Tolkien's The Lord of the Rings, as well as other lesser works. Over the length of this class, we will examine Tolkien's masterpiece as well as works by Lewis and Charles Williams. Showing Up For Yourself: NUSHU Group to Reflect & Connect ~ In-Person

NUSHU Group is a sharing circle where we create time and space to check in with ourselves through reflection, writing, and saying things out loud. In NUSHU Group, the facilitator offers prompts for your consideration. You will have a few minutes to reflect and write. You can go wherever your mind takes you, as deeply as you feel comfortable going. At the end of that time, the floor will be opened to sharing. You can say as much or as little as you would like. Pass or "come back to me" is always an option. In these groups, there is no crosstalk or advice giving. Sometimes being present and listening to each other really is more than enough. The group will be led by Katie Guillory, who is a certified NUSHU Group facilitator. She has a knack for asking just the right questions to unlock insight. You will be surprised by this experience. Voices from the Harlem Renaissance ~ In-Person

Spanning the years from the end of World War I through the Depression, the Harlem Renaissance was an artistic movement which encouraged Black artists, writers, musicians, and philosophers to explore in their works aspects of their racial identity, their culture, and the Black experience in America. This burst of creative expression could push back against Jim Crow and the prevailing beliefs about Blacks and Black life in America by giving voice to the experiences of people who had heretofore been silenced. By reading representative works from this significant period in American literature, we will have the chance to hear some of these voices and to reflect on the ways in which they resonate today.

The books for the semester are available through the registration form: *Their Eyes Were Watching God* by Zora Neale Hurston (\$15); *Cane* by Jean Toomer (\$12). Selected poetry will be provided or available on-line.

We the People: Part 2 ~ In-Person

This program is a continuation of the Winter 2024 'We the People.' Completion of Part 1 is required. This second semester we will cover the Bill of Rights and other key amendments.

The first three words of the preamble to the U.S. Constitution immediately differentiate this document from all those declarations of rights that had come before it. Who were the men, that are now referred to as the Framers of the Constitution? What were their main concerns and how do they echo today in our lives, over 230 years later? Why did they pick our form of government? Why even before the ink was dry on the main Seven Articles of the Constitution, did they feel the need to add the first ten amendments, known today as the Bill of Rights? What were the driving forces behind future important amendments?

We reviewed the main body of the original seven articles with an eye toward their interpretation then and now. We investigated the rather arcane institution known as the electoral college and the rules of the Senate, which are nowhere in the constitution.

During Winter semester, we will review some of the key rights bestowed in the U.S. Constitution such as freedom of speech, freedom of religion, the right to bear arms, and the right to due process and equal protection under the law. And, observe how the application of those rights has changed over time.

The goal of our journey is not to develop a cadre of Constitutional scholars but to fulfill Thomas Jefferson's famous challenge "...a well-informed electorate is a prerequisite to democracy."

What is Buddhism ~ In-Person

2500 years ago, a young prince puzzled over his place in the world and set out to find an answer. The result of that quest was his awakening as the Buddha. But what did the Buddha see, and how did his insights transform into the buddhism of today? Buddhism is neither a religion, nor a philosophy, nor is it a psychology. So what is it?

This class will give an introduction to the history and the enduring ideas and practices that make up buddhism. The emphasis will be on how the teachings of the Buddha in India 25 centuries ago - which addressed human existence - remain relevant today. The lectures will be accessible with plenty of time for exchange and discussion. No prior knowledge of buddhism is assumed. Lectures are cumulative and it is best to attend them all.



We'll cover shading, blending, textures, and the best tools for each. (Please note that graphite art in its full spectrum is not a vegan artform).

For those who prefer to purchase a kit, the Castle Arts 26-piece Graphite Pencil Art Set is recommended.
