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The Woman in the Attic: Jane Eyre and Wide Sargasso Sea

Attics are confined and isolated spaces, metaphorical reflections of the ways in which women can be controlled and limited by others. In Charlotte Bronte's Jane Eyre (1847) and in Wide Sargasso Sea (1966) by Jean Rhys, the lives of women and the forces that encourage or oppress them as they seek self-actualization and independence are themes which find voice. Though Rhys' book can stand alone, it is intended as a prequel to Bronte's because it focuses on characters who are central to Jane Eyre. Both novels provide a fascinating exploration of the relationships between men and women and how these are informed and defined by the societies they inhabit. That said, this course will not be a forum for "male-bashing" or aggressive feminist views. Rather, it will provide an opportunity to read and engage in animated discussion of the works themselves and to consider the expectations for and experiences of men and women in these important novels and in our world.



Imitate Monet's Shifting Light & Colors - Colored Pencil Drawing

Claude Monet studied the effects of light by painting the same subject in varying lighting conditions. His most well-known series were haystacks, water lilies, Rouen Cathedral, Waterloo Bridge. This approach allowed him to capture how changes in light would affect the colors, shadows, and overall mood of his works of art. In this colored pencil course, we will study how to depict your chosen subject, structure, or landscape at different times of day - dawn/sunrise, midday, sunset/dusk (i.e. alpenglow effect), and night-time. The primary focus will be on how colors shift from warm to cool tones, or saturate/desaturate, depending on the light source (sun, moon, street lamp) and atmospheric conditions (mist effect of fog, reflections from rain, etc). Materials: 9" X 12" pad of Canson XL Mixed Media white paper, a set of colored pencils (wax-based or watercolor pencils), hand-held sharpener, a pocket folder in which to store weekly reference sheets. Materials: For initial sessions, materials will be available in class.
